### Certificate III in Community Services

#### WHY STUDY IN COMMUNITY SERVICES?

The Certificate III in Community Services is a great way to start a career in community services. This qualification reflects the role of entry-level community services workers who support individuals through the provision of person-centred services. Work may include day-to-day support of individuals in community settings or support the implementation of specific community-based programs. It is an ideal qualification for someone looking to gain employment as a Financial Capability Worker and meets the minimum qualification requirements as set out by Department of Social Services.

#### WHAT SKILLS WILL STUDENTS GAIN?

This qualification will gives students the core skills in managing personal stressors in the workplace, working with diverse people, and the communication skills required for operating in community services organisations. At this level, work takes place under the direction of others and supervision may be direct or

indirect. Work may take place in a range of community services organisations in role such as:

- Financial Capability Worker
- Community Services Support Worker
- Neighbourhood Centre Worker



#### **About ICAN Learn**

ICAN Learn is an arm of the **Indigenous Consumer Assistance Network** (ICAN) and a not-for-profit registered training organisation focusing on financial counselling and financial capability education. Incorporated in 2007, ICAN has become a national leader in consumer advocacy, financial counselling and financial literacy for Indigenous people.

#### **About the course**

The Certificate III in Community Services compromises 12 units (5 core units and 7 elective units chosen by ICAN Learn which included the skill set in Financial Literacy Education) and is nationally accredited. If students wish to go on and complete a **Diploma of Community Services** or **Diploma of Financial Counselling**, there are up to 4 units that can be completed through a recognition of prior learning process.

#### **Entry** requirements

There are no course prerequisite qualifications. However, students are required to demonstrate literacy and numeracy skills in line with Certificate III level studies, confidence in their computer skills and be able to commit at least 6 to 8 hours per week of additional personal study time. Applicants should have interest and/or relevant experience in the social and community services field and have the appropriate maturity and interpersonal skills to work with a diverse range of people. This will be demonstrated in a pre-training interview.

#### **Delivery mode and duration**

This course is delivered self-paced over 6 months.

#### **Course fees**

The Certificate III in Community Services course fee is \$4500. This is payable over a scheduled invoicing period.
