WHY STUDY IN COMMUNITY SERVICES?

The Certificate IV in Community Services is a great way to start a vocational career in community services. ICAN Learn focuses the delivery on financial literacy and wellbeing so students can work with clients in the community who are doing it tough. As a community services worker, you will provide support, advocacy or interventions to individual clients, groups, or communities across a range of services.

WHAT SKILLS WILL STUDENTS GAIN?

This nationally recognised qualification is designed to give students entry level knowledge and skills necessary for a variety of roles in the community services sector as well as further study. At this level, workers may be autonomous with limited responsibility within established parameters and may be required to supervise and lead other workers

in projects or teams. Graduates will be qualified to work in the sector in a broad range of roles in community service organisations such as:

- ▶ Health education officer
- ▶ Community services worker
- ▶ Community support worker
- ▶ Support worker
- ▶ Welfare support worker
- ▶ Welfare worker
- ▶ Family support worker



About ICAN Learn

ICAN Learn is an arm of the **Indigenous Consumer Assistance Network (ICAN)** and a not-for-profit registered training organisation focusing on financial counselling and financial capability education. Incorporated in 2007, ICAN has become a national leader in consumer advocacy, financial counselling and financial literacy for Indigenous people.

About the course

The Certificate IV in Community Services comprises 15 units (7 core units and 8 elective units chosen by ICAN Learn) and is nationally accredited. There is no placement requirement for this course.

Entry requirements

To enrol in this course, students must have a Certificate III or at least two years' experience in the Community Services sector. They should demonstrate diploma-level literacy and numeracy, commit to the suggested study hours, and be able to collaborate using digital media.

Applicants should have interest and/or relevant experience in the social and community services field and have the appropriate maturity and interpersonal skills to work with a diverse range of people. This will be demonstrated in a pre-training interview.

Students must also have good computer skills.

Delivery mode and duration

This course is delivered in a combination of 3 units with compulsory online classes and 12 units self-paced with 12 months to complete assessments. In addition to the learning materials, students can access support from a trainer on a as-required basis.

Course fees

The Certificate IV in Community Services fee is \$4,500 which is payable over a scheduled invoicing period. More information about fees and payment options can be found on the ICAN Learn website.

Skills recognition

Skills recognition is available following enrolment and subject to a formal assessment process that measures the candidate's skills and knowledge from previous study, training, work or life experiences against the outcomes of the qualification in which they are enrolled.
