Diploma of Community Services

WHY STUDY IN COMMUNITY SERVICES?

The Diploma of Community Services is a great way to advance a career in community services. It is an ideal qualification for someone looking to transition from a financial counselling role into a more general community services role. This qualification reflects the role of community services workers involved in the delivery, management, and coordination of person-centred services to individuals, groups, and communities.

Workers support people to make change in their lives to improve personal and social wellbeing and may also have responsibility for the supervision of other workers and volunteers. They may also undertake case management and program coordination.

WHAT SKILLS WILL STUDENTS GAIN?

This nationally recognised qualification is designed to give students specialised knowledge and skills necessary for a variety of roles in the community services sector. At this level, workers have specialised skills in community services and work autonomously within their scope of practice under broad directions from senior management.

Graduates will be qualified to work in the sector in a broad range of roles in community service organisations such as:

- Social Housing Coordinator
- Community Services Worker
- Welfare Worker
- Case Manager
- ▶ Family Support Worker



About ICAN Learn

ICAN Learn is an arm of the **Indigenous Consumer Assistance Network** (ICAN) and a not-for-profit registered training organisation focusing on financial counselling and financial capability education. Incorporated in 2007, ICAN has become a national leader in consumer advocacy, financial counselling and financial literacy for Indigenous people.

About the course

The Diploma in Community Services comprises 20 units (12 core units and 8 elective units chosen by ICAN Learn) and is nationally accredited. If you have completed a Diploma of Financial Counselling, there are up to 10 units that can be completed through a recognition of prior learning process.

There is a placement requirement for this course of 200 hours.

Entry requirements

There are no course prerequisite qualifications. However, students are required to demonstrate literacy and numeracy skills in line with Diploma level studies, confidence in their computer skills and be able to commit at least 6 to 8 hours per week of additional personal study time. Applicants should have interest and/or relevant experience in the social and community services field and have the appropriate maturity and interpersonal skills to work with a diverse range of people. This will be demonstrated in a pretraining interview.

Delivery mode and duration

This course is delivered self-paced over 24 months.

Course fees

The full course fee for the Diploma of Community Services is \$5,500. For students that already hold a Diploma of Financial Counselling, course fees are reduced to \$2,500.
