WHY STUDY THE LEAD AND SUPPORT COLLEAGUES SKILL SET?

Not everyone sets out to be a leader. Many workers in financial counselling, financial capability and community services jobs end up becoming leaders of teams.

Leading others in a workplace is complex and requires specific skills and knowledge.

It's vital to understand key aspects of leadership and ways of working with others to do this well and to develop and retain personal and team wellbeing.

This course is an accredited skill set that provides students with knowledge and information about ways of working with others in a team to develop best practice and to develop confidence in their abilities.

WHAT SKILLS WILL STUDENTS GAIN?

This skill set reflects the skill requirements for team leaders or managers responsible for coordinating teams and supporting the wellbeing of colleagues working in stressful and demanding roles.

This includes implementing support processes to manage stress and emotional wellbeing of self or colleagues, facilitating structured de-briefing sessions to colleagues following incidents, supervising, and coordinating teams, and evaluating and enhancing own practice through a process of reflection and ongoing professional development.

About the course

The Lead and support colleagues skill set comprises 3 units of study and is nationally accredited. The skill set is not a full qualification and comprises the following 3 units of study:

Lead the work team

CHCMGT005

Facilitate workplace debriefing and support processes

CHCPRP003

Reflect on and improve own professional practice

Entry requirements

There are no course prerequisite qualifications, however students are required to demonstrate literacy and numeracy skills in line with Certificate IV level studies and be able to commit at 3 to 5 hours per week of personal study time. Applicants should have interest and/or relevant experience in the social and community services field and have the appropriate maturity and interpersonal skills to work with a diverse range of people.

Students must also have good computer skills.

Delivery mode and duration

This course is delivered self-paced with 13 weeks to complete assessments. In addition to the learning materials, students can access support from a trainer on a as-required basis.

Course fees
