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ICAN Learn is proud to offer a new scholarship program for 2025. The scholarships are available for people who identify as First Nations or those who predominately work or plan to work with First Nations communities.

The scholarships cover all course fees for either the: CHC51122 Diploma of Financial Counselling; or CHC32015 Certificate III in Community Services (including the skill set in Financial Literacy Education).

The delivery will be contextualised to working with First Nations people and communities and will delve into embedding the Indigenous Consumer Assistance Network's (ICAN Learn's parent organisation) wellbeing framework into practice. ICAN has been developing, testing, and refining its holistic financial counselling and financial capability practice framework over the past three years. Through adopting and adapting the Sustainable Livelihoods Framework to ICAN's financial counselling and financial capability services, ICAN has now embedded a strengths-based well-being framework that supports people to move from crisis ('surviving') towards a 'thriving' position. WHAT ROLES CAN I WORK IN ONCE I COMPLETE EITHER OF THESE COURSES?

The CHC51122 Diploma of Financial Counselling is the qualification required to work as a Financial Counsellor. Financial Counsellors help people who are experiencing financial difficulty and provide advice and support to help clients to get back on top of their financial issues.

The CHC32015 Certificate III in Community Services (Financial Capability) includes the skill set in Financial Literacy Education. It is a qualification that allows people to work in a variety of roles in the community services sector, including those seeking to work as Financial Capability Workers.

WHAT IF I DO THIS COURSE BUT THEN END UP NOT WORKING WITH FIRST NATIONS COMMUNITIES?

That's OK - this delivery will include all the content you would cover in any other delivery of these courses and some more! You'll be well equipped to work in a range of contexts.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO COMPLETE THE COURSE? HOW IT IS DELIVERED AND ARE THERE CLASSES?

CHC51122 Diploma of Financial Counselling is made up of 17 units (13 core and 4 electives chosen by ICAN Learn).

This course is delivered live online (in 'real-time') in weekly classes, over a 12-month period; class attendance is required. Please note: students are required to also complete a 220 hour 'Learning in the Workplace' experience.

CHC32015 Certificate III in Community Services (Financial Capability) is made up of 12 units. This course is delivered live online (in 'real-time') with classes over a 6-month period; class attendance is required.

I CAN'T COMMENCE STUDY IN 2025. CAN I STILL APPLY?

This is a pilot project and scholarships are only available for delivery commencing 2025. Please check on our website for other scholarship opportunities.

HOW DO I APPLY?

To apply for the scholarships you must:

- 1. Identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander or currently work or plan to work predominately with First Nations communities.
- 2. Email administration@icanlearn.edu.au to express your interest.
- 3. Complete the Scholarship Application (the link will be provided upon receipt of your expression of interest).
