WHY STUDY THE RURAL FINANCIAL COUNSELLING SPECIALISATION?

Rural financial counselling is a specialist area of work. The units provided in this course are elective units in the Diploma of Financial Counselling CHC51122 that provide specific learning for financial counsellors to work in the role of a Rural Financial Counsellor.

Not all financial counsellors are rural financial counsellors. It takes specific skills to work in this designated role. It's not simply about working in a rural location, it's a totally different job!

Rural financial counsellors are funded to work with primary producers who are in financial difficulty. The work is complex and includes aspects of succession planning through analysing the financial situation and business position of the primary producer.

WHAT SKILLS WILL STUDENTS GAIN?

This course is nationally accredited and provides students with the skills and knowledge to work in and adapt existing practice to a rural context. This includes using a strengthsbased and client focused financial counselling process to target the specific needs of rurally based clients.

Entry requirements

There are no course prerequisite qualifications, however students are required to demonstrate literacy and numeracy skills in line with Certificate IV level studies and be able to commit at 3 to 5 hours per week of personal study time. Applicants should have interest and/or relevant experience in the social and community services field and have the appropriate maturity and interpersonal skills to work with a diverse range of people.

Students must also have good computer skills.

Delivery mode and duration

This course is delivered self-paced with 13 weeks to complete assessments. In addition to the learning materials, students can access support from a trainer on a as-required basis.

Course fees
