CommBank continues to make a long-term investment into the future of learning opportunities for Indigenous Australians by partnering with ICAN Learn to provide education scholarships.

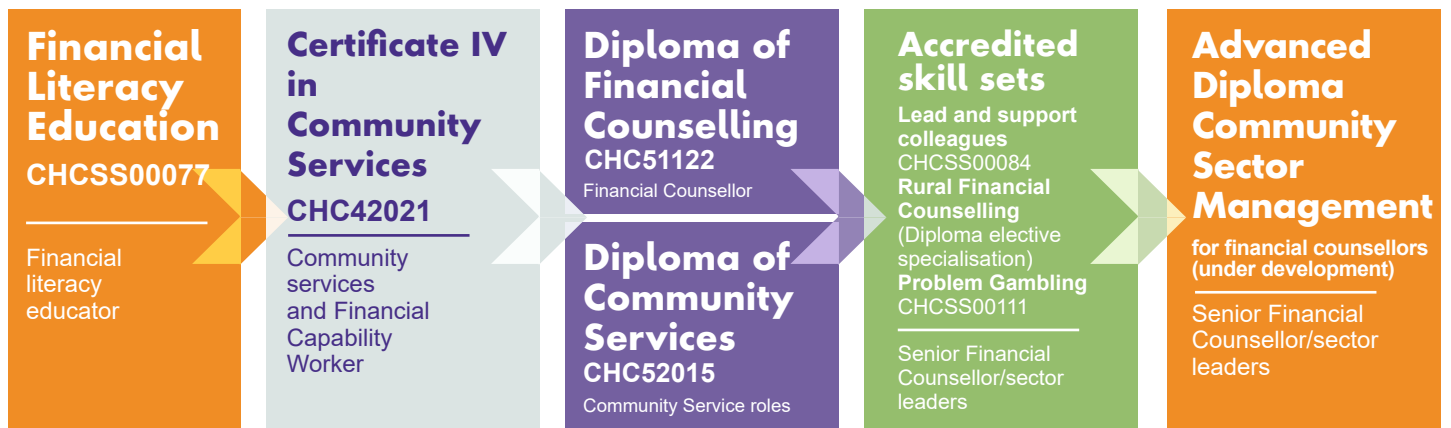
About ICAN Learn

How do I get a scholarship?

To get a scholarship, you **must**

1. Identify as Aboriginal / Torres Strait Islander; and
2. Be ready to learn and commit to study; and
3. Complete and submit an online scholarship application form; and
4. Attend a pre-training interview if accepted; and
5. Meet all aspects of course enrolment (includes requirements for Language, Literacy and Numeracy)

When do applications open and close?
